Humanitarian Aid

After the fall of the Krajina and the tragic events in Bosnia which altogether created more than 400,000 Serbian refugees a very large proportion of our time was spent on collecting, packing and sending humanitarian aid. In a joint effort with our Church we collected and sent six truckloads of clothes and food, totalling over 50,000 clothing items. Many and many hours were spent by Barbara, Eva, Rada, Srdjan, Steva J, Steva R, Sasa, the entire Velickovic family, Gordana and Branko, Bojan, Branko and Angela, Branka, Holly, Radica and John, Marko and Rebecca, Gina and Lee, Igor, Zorica and Zoran, Dragica, Steven, Charles, Stojan, Bane, Mirjana, Ljilja, Nikola, Dragana, Kiyoshi and Gordana.

Clothes and food were collected among our people, however a very large amount was donated to SANE by many churches and temples from the Boston area. Some of

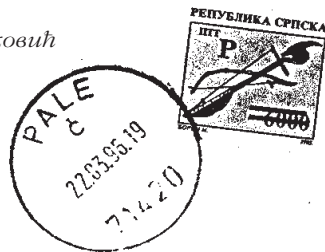

At The White House With Hillary

On January 29, 1996 the Serbian American Alliance of New England was recognized by the First Lady, Hillary Rodham Clinton, for its humanitarian efforts in Bosnia. The First Lady invited the President of SANE to the White House at a meeting to honor organizations engaged in humanitarian assistance to the people of Bosnia. Particularly pleasant were the moments which the First Lady spent with the representatives of the IOCC and representatives of Serbian Americans. Gordana Todorov made a point of mentioning the Krajina Serbs to the First Lady. Mrs. Clinton showed true awareness and understanding of the tragedy of the Krajina people.



Where Has SANE Been?

As always, members of SANE are faithful attendees at various lectures in the Greater Boston area. Our voice is important and we offer the balance which is so often lacking in these presentations!

December 8th, 1995

Gordana Todorov, Michael Pravica and Barbara Gruber along with a Muslim doctor who was affiliated with the Bosnian Ministry of Health all spoke at the Central Congregational Church about the Civil War in Yugoslavia. To a small but interested audience they shared their views, politely, and were amazed to learn that Bosnian Muslim "intellectuals" believe that Yugoslavia will be reconstituted in ten years. A lively discussion ensued! An interesting fact is that they all agreed on two points important for a lasting peace in Bosnia: first, all sides, including Republika

Srpska, should be supported in their economic developments and second, no sides should be armed.

December 13th, 1995

Michael Pravica, representing SANE, along with fifteen other Serbs representing a diverse group including the IOCC, Serbian Media, refugees and members of the Serbian Orthodox Church, met in Washington with key U.S. Government officials, Sandy Vershbow, the point person of the National Security Council on Bosnia and Senior Director for European Affairs at the National Security Council, and Sandy Berger, U.S. Deputy National Security Adviser.

Michael felt that this meeting was an effort to enroll Serbian Americans in support of the peace plan. Michael expressed his dismay at the "arrogance" of our gov-

ernment officials, as well as the emotional rambling of many Serbs in attendance, however he did feel that he was able to deliver two key points:

1. The violation of the constitution with regard to the illegal secession of Bosnia
2. Military "advisors" from the U.S. aiding Croatia. Clearly recent articles endorse this fact even though it was categorically denied by U.S. Officials.

In summary. Michael felt that a door had been opened and further dialogue with Serbs would be in order.

March 5th, 1996

Northeastern University hosted a lecture by John Yemma of the Boston Globe and Bob Marquand of the Christian Science Monitor. Both speakers ignored discussion of any Serbian suffering throughout this

conflict, and Mr. Marquand appeared to believe that blame for all of the civil War could be laid at Milosevic feet!

SANE Members Mike, Branka, Charles and Gordana were able to point out the obvious "omissions" that the media continue to make and urged a more even handed approach to further reporting.

March 7th, 1996

Ivo Banac at Wellesley College proved a vituperative event for our Igor Neifeld, Michael Pravica and Stevan Radojev. Clearly, Prof. Banac made every attempt to cast the Serbs in the role of Nazi-collaborators, to lift the blame of genocide in the death of 700,000+ Serbs by saying "one cannot condemn an entire people for that one event"!

When questioned about the "destruction" of Dubrovnik, Banac claimed that 70% of the old city had sustained damage. Upon confrontation, citing Prof. Peter Maher's visit to Dubrovnik in which he found only the Serbian Orthodox Library gutted, Banac shouted "you are a Serb propagandist" to the questioner.

An earlier confrontation at Yale University Between Prof. Banac and a Member of FRJ Embassy in Washington shows conclusively that efforts to rewrite Balkan History will always meet with a good Serb who intends that truth will prevail!



March 31, 1996

For the third time SANE was invited to the Central Congregational Church. This time Stevan Radojev came well prepared, as always, and explained numerous points of the Dayton Peace Agreement and also gave an update on the implementation of the agreement. The well intentioned and eager to be more informed American people in the Church asked many questions even after the official meeting was over.

April 1st, 1996

Mike Pravica spoke at the Boston Center for Adult Education to an audience of about 40 people. Aided with his map showing the ethnic demographic make-up before the civil war, Mike spoke of the changes wrought by the war and the faithful bands of refugees displaced by the horrors around them. Emphases by questioners surrounded the lies hatched by media "misinformation". The positive result of this lecture was a better understanding of the Serbian side, and a cautionary word about acceptance of "Media hype".

April 2nd, 1996

At Simmons College, Andras Riedlemeyer, curator of the Aga Khan collection of Islamic architecture at Harvard University, spoke about the destruction of culture in Bosnia-Herzegovina. More specifically, he focused on the destruction of Muslim cultural monuments. As in many previous lectures throughout our academic community, we are faced with a narrow perspective which disallows the opportunity to review all sides.

In order to expand the possibilities of looking at the problems, questions were raised by Gina, Lee, Igor, Steva, Gordana, Mike and Maria.

April 4th, 1996

Mike Pravica spoke to a group of Jewish retirees at Center in Brooklyn. In a repeat performance, Mike spoke for the Serbs and reiterated the message that the Serbs (alas) lost the propaganda war in 1991. The bond between Jews and Serbs has been eroded in the past five years, due mainly to the work of Ruder-Finn. Thus it was important for Mike to uphold our position as Serbian-Americans.

May 13th, 1996

When William Perry spoke at Harvard's J.F.K. School of Government on May 13th, Mike, Shawn, Igor, Steva, Charles and Milorad were there to confront him. Secretary Perry spoke for an hour. Then it was question time.

Mike questioned Perry's comments about "bringing democracy" to new nations which Mike referred to as "postage-stamp republics." He blasted the American military intervention in Bosnia and Croatia last August and September that led to the ethnic cleansing of 450,000 Serbs and ridiculed the hypocrisy of a US policy that violated the constitution of the former republic of Bosnia which as we all know required the approval of all ethnic groups in Bosnia before secession from the former Yugoslavia.

Shawn Murphy asked Perry if the U.S. was starting to behave like ancient Rome (quoting some historical statements) in it's treatment of smaller- less powerful nations. Perry - initially pretending not to understand the question, answered with a resounding: No!

The entire program, including our splendid performance, was broadcast on C-SPAN.

Autistic Serbian Child Being Treated in Boston

Filip Zebic, the 3 year old autistic son of Serbian Orthodox Priest, Father Aleksandar Zebic from England, has started therapy and treatment at the Boston Higashi School in September.

The therapy this school employs has already proven to be effective for Filip.

Filip's parents and friends have been continuously organizing fund raising to cover the \$85,000.00 annual cost of the treatment.

The following letter was sent by Maria Jerinic to the President of Wellesley College regarding the Pro-Croatian Wellesley conference last February.

Dear President Walsh:

It has been almost seven years since I graduated, yet my Wellesley education has remained a source of pride in my life. Wellesley College fostered in me a deep sense of moral responsibility for my world and taught me the importance of an open-minded rational approach to all issues, personal and political. As a current Ph.D. candidate and college instructor, I attempt to run an open democratic classroom that allows for the airing of all points of view. I struggle constantly to keep my personal opinions out of the classroom.

As a Wellesley graduate, I am outraged and saddened to see the prejudiced program Wellesley is offering on the Bosnian civil war. The one-sided bias of this conference is totally antithetical to the principles espoused by my Wellesley professors. In this conference, will there be any opportunity for dialogue or for open exchange? What is the agenda of the conference? The list of speakers implies that this conference seems more interested in promoting US/NATO imperial interests in the Balkan region.

All sides bear deep responsibility for this tragic civil war. To prevent future horrors, we need to truly educate ourselves and others. The perpetuation of biased propaganda, whether intentional or not, will only cause more devastation.

U.S. should address its ills, not Bosnia's

I would like to thank Don Feder for his excellent column, "New World Type debates Bosnia" (Dec. 4):

The time, money, and effort (and soon perhaps American lives) being wasted by our politicians on Bosnia is appalling in the face of more press-

ing problems facing our own society.

President Clinton is committing 25,000 American troops to preserve the fiction of the former Yugoslav republic of Bosnia which was never in its history a country (think of it as the residue from and chessboard of the great empires that collided there), but will not commit this number of soldiers to fight our war on drugs, crime, and poverty which threaten the stability of our nation.

In fact, our leaders appear more concerned with maintaining America's prestige in Europe by finding a lame excuse that will give NATO a "purpose" by illegally colonizing and terrorizing the former Yugoslavia (which was never a NATO member), blowing well over \$2 billion in the process, than with solving America's budget crisis.

Many of our leaders have simply grown out of touch with reality and would rather play ridiculous and chivalrous games on the world front than deal with the harder problems at home.

Hill on Bosnia.

Regarding James Hill's column, "The Tragic Flaw of Bosnia-Herzegovina," (Opinions, March 22) it appears that the West has wanted to preserve the fiction of Bosnia as a nation in the interest of giving NATO a "purpose" that will justify its continued senseless existence by terrorizing and colonizing this former Yugoslav republic - the residue of the great empires that collided there. However, as soon as any sense of democracy is restored to this amalgam of three nations (as defined by its violated former constitution), the following should be clear: An overwhelming majority of the Bosnian Croats and of the Bosnian Serbs want out of a Muslim-dominated state and given that the sum total of their populations (1.3 million Bosnian Serbs plus 750,000 Bosnian Croats equals 2.05 million) is greater than the number of Bosnian Muslims (1.9 million) - all numbers from the prewar census - it should seem evident that it is only a matter of time before they will jointly vote to separate from the Bosnian Muslims as soon as the political conditions are favorable.

If the integrity and sovereignty of the former Yugoslavia was not worth keeping, then why

must we insist on the inviolability of Bosnia's borders when Bosnia is simply a microcosm of the former Yugoslavia.

the churches were so pleased with our handling of the donations that they called us and offered us more clothes after their next rummage sales. David Mladinov did an excellent job of talking to the Jewish community and explaining the tragic situation of Serbian refugees and as a consequence he was able to collect carloads of clothes in the Jewish Cultural Center.

After clothes collected by SANE were prepared for shipping, i.e. sorted, packed and boxes carefully labeled they were transported to St.Sava Church. Srdjan and Steva did most of the transporting, although many other people helped by coming with their cars whenever possible, filling their cars and taking them to the Church. At that point, our Priest Father Vljakovic with other members of the Church, mostly the Grkovic family, would completely take the responsibility for filling out the final forms, weighing and measuring the boxes, filling U-Haul, finding drivers and driving to Elizabeth, New Jersey, where the boxes were delivered to the people from Serbian Relief, who would put the aid into containers and then ship them to Yugoslavia. Father Filaret was responsible for distributing the aid to the areas which needed it most.

Paralyzed Serbian Teenager Looking for Scholarship

Danijela Djokic was left a paraplegic at age 13, after being shot by a sniper in Kosovo, and was brought to the United States for treatment by the International Organization for Migration in October 1993. The Veterans for Peace organization from New Hampshire procured free medical services and arranged for Daniela to stay with the Jules family. They also provided a small stipend to the family to help defray the costs of Daniela's stay while she finishes high school. This stipend ran out in April 1995 and the Jules family has cared for Daniela since then on their own.

Despite her disability Daniela has done very well in high school where she is a Junior. Upon Daniela's graduation the Jules family commitment ends.

SANE felt that Daniela's success in living a normal and productive life despite her disability is largely dependent on her staying in the United States, and in March 1996 established a fund to help Daniela pay for college. SANE is also looking into various scholarships.
